

Safe, Healthy, Hands Reduce the spread of germs





When should you sanitize your hands?

- ♦ If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol
- Soap and water work to remove all types of germs from hands, while sanitizer acts by killing certain germs on the skin. Although alcohol-based hand sanitizers can quickly reduce the number of germs in many situations, they should be used in the right situations
- DO NOT use hand sanitizer if your hands are visibly dirty or greasy- for example, after custodial duties, household chores, playing outdoors, etc. If a hand washing station is available, wash your hands with soap and water instead.

Proper Hand Care With Sanitizer



Apply product to palm of dry hands (use enough product to cover all hand surfaces)



Rub hands together palm to palm



Rub in between fingers



Rub back of each hand with palm of opposite hand



Rub fingertips of each hand in opposite palm, as well as each thumb



Rub hands until product is dry. Do not use paper towels to dry

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
